IEEE WIE aims:

The IEEE Women in Engineering of Region 8 would like to address the following issues (particularly during WIE sessions and events at IEEE conferences):

- how to prepare high school girls to make an unprejudiced choice regarding their study and careers in Science & Engineering and give them good background for that;
- how to seal the academic pipeline of women in order to minimize the "pipe leakage" phenomena;
- how to overcome barriers for the advancement of women already working in Science & Engineering;
- and how to combine a career with family life.

Our society cannot afford to lose women's talents in Science & Engineering.

Introduction:

Women in Engineering of Region 8 (Europe, Africa & Middle East) has shown a progress both in increased number of members and in number of the new affinity groups formed in the past year. The achievements will be presented in this report.

- ✓ Total IEEE WIE membership was 13,418 in January 2011, while R8 WIE membership was 2,580 at the same time which represents 19.22% of WIE total members.
- ✓ WIE R8 forms 24 regular AGs and 44 Student Branch AGs, 68 in total.





Goals:

- ✓ Promote IEEE membership and retention of IEEE women members.
- ✓ Increase the number of WIE AGs.
- ✓ Maintain an advisory relationship with the local WIE Affinity Groups and provide guidance and assistance to them.
- ✓ Inspire and support organizers of conferences in R8 (at global, regional and local level) to organize accompanying WIE sessions with keynote speakers' presentations (successful role models for generations to come) followed by a panel discussion on the WIE session issues, which are of importance not only to the society of women in science and engineering but to the general public as well.
- ✓ Completing the database of R8 WIE AGs contacts on the base of 2010 IEEE WIE Roster.
- ✓ Coordinate the Clementina Saduwa Award.
- ✓ Gather information about IEEE WIE activities in Region 8 and disseminate them through R8 news and WIE Magazine
- ✓ Provide support for Membership Elevation.
- ✓ Gather and disseminate information of status of IEEE women members at the regional level.
- ✓ Search out women in the Sections/AGs who could serve as role models and outline their activities/status to the WIE R8 members (push ahead articles about them to WIE Magazine).
- ✓ Form a subgroup of advisers (invited volunteers, among them former R8 WIE Coordinators) in order to help to activate the plan.

As part of the IE Foundation's dedication to supporting professional women throughout their career development process, the Foundation has partnered with the IEEE's Women in Engineering (WIE) initiative to bring top women engineers from Europe, Middle East and Africa to Madrid for advanced studies in management. The collaboration includes various joint initiatives, including a scholarship program.

2011 Clementina Saduwa Award:

Objectives of the Award:

To recognize a women engineer in Region 8 who, through her engineering and career achievements, has demonstrated noteworthy support for women in the profession and have established a benchmark of engineering excellence and of the following eligibility criteria.

Amount of the Award: set to 2000 US\$.

The contest was having a great challenge between the contestants who shows a very high level of achievements. The final decision of a jury composed of 5, was based on various aspects, not only CV but also statement, level of difficulties in achieving a professional career, reference letters, level of involvement of referees, among others.

The winner of 2011 Clementina Saduwa Award is Dr. Ilhem Kallel from Tunisia for her professional and personal achievements. She can serve as a role model for combining professional achievements and family life.
